- Show:** ILR Show Division
- Points:** This is a **double point** halter show and **single point** performance show with many non-ILR point classes included.
- Show Entry:** The show is set up to use ILR Show Manager for show entries online or you may enter by mail by completing the show packet.
- Entry Deadline:** Registration must be received by May 8th to be included in the show program.
- Health Requirements:** Health certificates of Veterinarian Inspection are required for all llamas traveling across Oregon state lines. Show staff will not be checking health papers, this is the exhibitor's responsibility.
- Arrival:** Show staff will be available for check-in from Noon - 9:00 pm Friday, May 15th.
- Departure:** All llamas must be out of the stalls by 9:00 am Monday, May 18th.
- ILR or ARI Registration:** All animals must have a copy of a Registration Certificate with the entry forms or at check-in if they have not registered thru the ILR Show Manager. Excluded from this requirement are animals used for Youth Classes and non-ILR classes.
- Awards:** Ribbons will be awarded for 1st - 5th place in each class. Grand and Reserve Champions in all divisions will be awarded ribbons and special prizes. 1st place GOS and POD will be awarded special prizes. We will also be awarding Ribbons and awards to the Best of Show Male and Female Llamas.
- Camping:** Camping spaces available, \$15.00 dry and \$21.00 with utilities

CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

LLAMA AGE DIVISIONS:

Juvenile (5 mos. - 12 mos.)

Yearling (12 mos. - 24 mos.)

Mature (Adult) (24 mos. And over)

On a llama's date of birth, the llama moves up to the next age group.

WOOL DIVISIONS:

Suri Wool - wool hangs and drapes over the body forming a natural part along the spine. Fibers are grouped into a distinctive and well defined lock structure

Classic Wool - Double coat with abundant guard hair, short neck wool, smooth face and leg wool/hair.

Silky Wool - Moderate to long body wool that lays close to the skin without suri lock or loft, minimal to abundant leg wool that lays close to the skin without loft, neck wool that lacks loft and lays down against the skin.

Light/Medium Wool - Minimal to long body wool, smooth to moderate leg wool.

Heavy Wool - abundant body and neck wool, minimal to abundant head and leg wool, leg wool at least to knee and hock.

SEX DIVISIONS:

Male classes are for intact males.

Female classes are for fertile, breed-able females.

Non-breeder - is for geldings or infertile females. This category has no sex or wool divisions.

YOUTH AGES:

Junior Youth - (8 - 11 yrs.)

Intermediate Youth (12 - 14 yrs.)

Senior Youth (15 - 18 yrs.)

The age divisions may be combined if there are fewer than 8 total entries in any two of the age categories. Youth ages are: 8 yr. olds as of their birthday. 9 - 18 yrs. as January 1, 2009

FYI - It is recommended that exhibitors 8 - 12 years of age not show intact males over 24 months of age, with the choice of acceptance or decline lying with the show management.

NON - ILR POINT CLASSES:

Costume - Judging criteria includes originality, training, time and energy involved, etc.

Jackpot Obstacle - This is a timed event. Open to any age llama and handler. Points will be deducted for safety and performance faults.

Maiden Performance Classes - These classes are open to any llama that has never entered a performance class or has never won a ribbon in one.

CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

NON - ILR POINT CLASSES CONT'D:

String-a-Long Pack - Participants in this class must lead a 3 llama pack string through various obstacles that they might encounter on the trail. All llamas in the string-a-long must wear packs filled out as they would be on the trail.

OBSTACLE: Llamas may be entered in only one of the obstacle divisions (Youth or Open)

Novice - Class is open to any animal over 5 mos. that has not placed 1st-3rd three times in Novice Obstacle.

Advanced - This class is open to any animal over 5 mos. of age.

Maiden - This class is open to any llama that has never entered an Obstacle class or never ribboned. (*Non ILR point*)

PUBLIC RELATIONS: Llamas may be entered in only one of the Public Relations (Youth or Open)

Novice - Class is open to any animal over 5 mos. That has not placed 1st-3rd three times in Novice Public Relations.

Advanced - Class is open to an animal over 5 mos. of age.

Maiden - This class is open to any llama that has never entered a Public Relations class or never ribboned. (*Non ILR point*)

PACK: Llamas may be entered in only one of the Pack divisions. (Youth or Open)

Novice - Class is open to any animal that has not placed 1st-3rd three times in Novice Pack. Llamas over 36 mos. must carry weight.

Advanced - Class is open to any animal over 5 mos. Llamas over 36 mos. Must carry weight.

Maiden - This class is open to any llama that has never entered a pack class or never ribboned. Llamas must wear a pack filled out as it would be on the trail. (*Non ILR point*)

String-a-Long - Participants in this class must lead a 3 llama pack string through various obstacles that they might encounter on the trail. All llamas in the string-a-long must wear packs filled out as they would be on the trail. (*Non ILR point*)

OBSTACLE DRIVING: Driving classes are open to any cart-pulling llama. No riders permitted.

PLEASURE DRIVING:

PERFORMANCE AWARDS:

To compete for Grand Champion Performance Llama, the llama must enter at least 2 Advanced performance events. To compete for Grand Champion Novice Performance Llama, the llama must enter all 3 novice performance events. Highest point total determines the champions.

Grand and Reserve Champion Junior, Intermediate, and Senior Youth will be awarded.

\$50.00 for the overall Maiden Performance winner. Must enter all three Maiden classes to qualify.

\$50.00 for the String-a-Long winner

Jackpot pays - 1st =50%, 2nd=30%, and 3rd=20% of the pot

Costume pays - 1st=\$25.00, 2nd=\$15.00, and 3rd=\$10.00

Directions to Prineville and Crook County Fairgrounds:

From Portland - Take Hwy 26 past Mt.Hood and head towards Bend. At Madras, Hwy 26 and Hwy 97 will merge. You should continue south through Madras. Just south of Madras you will come to a junction where Hwy 97 will continue south and Hwy 26 will veer off to the left towards Prineville and John Day. Take this exit and head to Prineville. Once in Prineville you will go east through town on Hwy 26. Look for signs to the fairgrounds. At the stoplight, you will make a right turn . . . head to the main entrance of the fairgrounds. The entrance is just past an RV Campground.

From the South - Take Hwy 97 to Bend. You will reach a "Y" where Hwy 97 heads left to Portland or goes right to business 97. Take the Hwy to the left and head to Redmond. At Redmond you will come to a major intersection. Follow signs to Hwy 126 east to Prineville. This will be a gentle right turn. You will come to a stop sign a couple of blocks later. Take a right to Prineville continuing to follow Hwy 126 east. Once in Prineville you will go east through town. Look for signs to the fairgrounds. At the stoplight, you will make a right turn ... head to the main entrance of the fairgrounds. The entrance is just past an RV Campground.

From Eugene/Salem - Take Hwy 126 to Sisters. From Sisters continue on Hwy 126 to Redmond. At Redmond continue on Hwy 126 following signs to Prineville. Once in Prineville you will go east through town. Look for signs to the fairgrounds. At the stoplight, you will make a right turn ... head to the main entrance of the fairgrounds. The entrance is just past an RV Campground.

From the East/Burns - Take Hwy 20 towards Bend. Approximately 10 miles prior to reaching Bend, there will be a right turn. The sign will read "Powell Butte, Prineville" (and maybe Alfalfa). Take this turn and continue on this road several miles. You will go past the Bend airport. Continue until you reach Hwy 126. There will be a stop sign at this junction. Turn right (east) and follow Hwy 126 to Prineville. Once in Prineville you will go east through town. Look for signs to the fairgrounds. At the stoplight, you will make a right turn ... head to the main entrance of the fairgrounds. The entrance is just past an RV Campground.
